ressed in perfectly pressed uniforms, the cadets glide across the polished floor of the gymnasium, their eyes focused in front of them and their feet marching in rhythmic unison as they pivot into complicated formations. These Cobb County students from Lassiter, Pope and Kell high schools represent the award-winning Lassiter-Pope-Kell Navy Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps, also known as NJROTC, a Navy-sanctioned high school program that emphasizes citizenship, service to the country, personal responsibility and leadership skills among those enrolled in its classes. The program also promotes volunteerism through community-

There are more than 600 NJROTC units in the U.S., each with one or more instructors who guide the students through intensive scholastic curricula. For six years, Capt. James "Jim" Minta served alongside 1st Sgt. Lorenzo Cox as a naval science instructor for the Lassiter-Pope-Kell unit. In 2017, the two instructors realized there were greater lessons to teach the cadets beyond military history, strategies, ship schematics, weather and weaponry.

"Two brothers in our unit were killed in a car accident. Their sister was also a cadet in our program," retired military officer Minta says. "It was a devastating loss for all of us. Our unit had an active role in the memorial service."

In the days and weeks that followed, Minta and Cox facilitated lots of conversations and hugs. Many of the students had never experienced death on a personal level, and the two men helped them as they mourned and learned how to show up for others in times of distress.

"We took care of each other, and we supported the family during that difficult time," remembers Cox, a retired Marine with 23 years of service. "We laughed, we cried and we prayed together, and we soon found our way forward."

Eighteen months later, a cadet took his own life, and members of the unit found themselves companions in grief

"We've lost too many cadets here," Cox says. "Each time, we dealt with our grief together—as a unit."

Minta and Cox say that NJROTC not only prepares cadets academically but also builds unbreakable bonds, helps students develop high levels of caring and compassion and teaches them how to navigate the ups and downs of life. Time after time, the 130 or so students at Lassiter-Pope-Kell win awards (two Unit Achievement Awards and three Distinguished Unit Awards in the last five years) and rise above all obstacles to embody the Navy's core values of honor, courage and commitment.

Minta, who retired from teaching in June, says that he and Cox represent the hundreds of NJROTC instructors in the U.S. who work with young people to help them "become better citizens." But their effort's go far beyond that. Through their mentoring, leadership and love, Cox, Minta and teachers like them are helping to build better people. 🖔
